Working within 2 metres	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Staff • Contractors • Anyone else who physically comes into contact with you, in relation to your business • Audience Members • Persons hiring the facilities (cast, creative teams, studio users) 	4	4	16	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Always consider if the task can be performed differently without having to breach the 2m social distancing rule • Any activities requiring prolonged contact under 2m should be specifically risk assessed • Workers are to limit face to face working and work facing away from each other when possible • Limit the frequency of working within 2m to an absolute minimum and ensure it is for strictly low intensity, sporadic work where exposure to this distance is less than 15 mins • Sites should consider RPE (Masks) for Coronavirus (Covid-19) where the two metre social distancing guidelines is not met. • All equipment to be thoroughly cleaned prior and after using it. • Increased ventilation will be provided within enclosed spaces • Consideration given to disposable gloves and eyewear to prevent and reduce potential contamination • Reusable PPE should be thoroughly cleaned after use and not shared between workers. 	4	2	8
